> > The Chair is responsible for leading faculty in the development of program curricula, identity, and relevance. The Chair serves as an advocate for art history faculty both individually and collectively. Additional responsibilities include college and university service, teaching in the program, student mentoring, and sustaining relevant professional activities.

The Chair reports to the Dean and works closely with CVAD's Associate Deans, their fellow chairs, and the director of the Foundations Program as a part of the college's leadership team.
