12 WEEK SEMINAR COURSE

The course is the foundation of CRMI. Scaffolding lectures, class discussions, readings and blog posts the seminars will serve as a space for students to grapple with the history of the Civil Rights Movement, Black grassroots organizing and collective resistance.

1 WEEK IMMERSIVE TRIP

Upon concluding the seminar series students will embark on a week-long Civil Rights Trip throughout the South. This history will come to life as students visit different cities, historic sites and speak with veterans of the Movement.

Using digital and physical archives, along with oral histories students will engage in analytical research and hone writing skills by producing a research paper around a topic of choice.

1 PUBLIC LUNCH TALK

At the end of the program students are required to give a public talk at Brown University sharing their experience with their family, peers, and the community.
